## Climate Change and the Long Island Sound Estuary Workshop Application

On Thursday, October 2, 2014, a teacher professional development workshop will be held at Alley Pond Environmental Center in Queens. At this workshop, the selected teachers will learn how to incorporate climate change and Long Island Sound concepts and activities into their existing curricula.

To be selected for this workshop, teachers are required to complete this application and mail it to Amy Mandelbaum, Long Island Sound Study Outreach Coordinator at New York Sea Grant, by **Friday, September 19, 2014.** This workshop is limited to twenty (20) middle school teachers from NYC Department of Education – Districts 4, 7, 8, 24, 25, 26, and 30.

If selected, the teacher is required to attend the workshop on **Thursday, October 2, 2014 at 9:00am to 2:30pm at Alley Pond Environmental Center, 228-06 Northern Blvd., Douglaston, NY 11362**. Selected teachers will receive a \$50 stipend paid by New York Sea Grant - Cornell University if they attend the full day workshop. Teachers will also receive a certificate of completion from New York Sea Grant, Long Island Sound Study, and New York State Marine Education Association (NYSMEA). An additional \$100 stipend is available if they complete a climate change activity with their class by January 2, 2015. Details about the climate change activity will be provided at the workshop.
