When disposable plastic bags, bottles, straws, and other plastics end up on shoreline habitats and in the water they pose a threat to Long Island Sound's wildlife.

The Long Island Sound Study's #DontTrashLISound #ProtectOurWildlife campaign looks at preventing plastic waste in Long Island Sound by encouraging people to bring reusable bags and bottles to Long Island Sound beaches, parks, and Stewardship Areas!

Corals and sea anemones in #LISound? Yes! These animals of the seafloor, which belong to the same phylum group, Cnidaria, or "stinging needles," live in boulder reef habitat. The northern red anemone, *Urticina feline*, catches food from plankton to small fish using its tentacles that are heavily armed with stinging cells (nematocysts) and then brings the food toward its mouth.
