Fish make up about 99% of the osprey's diet, so it's no wonder that this majestic bird is also known as the fish hawk! The osprey was close to extinction in the 1970s, but their numbers rebounded after DDT was banned in North America. Scientists believe that the toxic effect of the pesticide was reducing the bird's ability to reproduce.
